## Using this checklist

\* Indicates non-native species.

### Breeding status

- (B) **Breeding:** Confirmed as breeding in Yellowstone including historic breeding.
- (b) **Unconfirmed breeding:** Suspected of breeding, but not confirmed by eggs or young.

### Seasons

- (Sp) **Spring:** mid-March–early June
- (S) **Summer:** early June–mid-August
- (F) **Fall:** mid-August–November
- (W) **Winter:** December–mid-March

### Abundance Categories

- (A) **Abundant:** Found in moderate to large numbers and easily found in appropriate habitat.
- (C) **Common:** Found in moderate numbers and usually easy to find in appropriate habitat.
- (U) **Uncommon:** Found in small numbers and usually, but not always, found with some effort in appropriate habitat.
- (R) **Rare:** Occurs annually in very small numbers or in a very restricted habitat. Difficult to find.
- (O) **Occasional:** Occurs in some years, but not every year.

## Reminder: Appreciate Birds RESPONSIBLY and RESPECTFULLY

- The use of audio bird calls is illegal in the park.
- Approaching on foot within 25 yards (23 m) of wildlife, including birds, is prohibited in Yellowstone.
- All birds are sensitive to human disturbance, especially during the nesting season.
- Do not feed birds or any wildlife. Feeding animals is prohibited in the park.

Yellowstone National Park offers birds an array of habitat types: lower elevation sagebrush-grasslands and riparian-willow communities, mid-elevation forests of lodgepole pines and other conifers, high elevation alpine meadows and whitebark pine forests. The park's signature geyser basins and areas of thermal features also provide habitat for birds year-round. Consequently, a diversity of birds occurs in the park, especially during migration and summer.

This checklist follows the American Ornithological Society, *Checklist of North American Birds*, and was revised in May, 2020. Bird species that are accidental, vagrant, and those with few verified observations have been grouped at the end of the checklist. Some species listed in previous revisions lacked adequate documentation, so they were removed from the current checklist. This checklist was designed to help you determine the likelihood of observing various bird species.

Thank you for your interest in the birds of Yellowstone. Your observations contribute to knowledge and conservation of birds found here.
